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CHAPTER 1

Spectra RioBroker Partial File Restore Plugin Overview

This section provides a general overview for the Spectra[®] RioBroker Partial File Restore plugin.

If your MAM client does not use the Spectra RioBroker application, see the *BlackPearl Partial File Restore (PFR) User Guide*.

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The Spectra RioBroker application is designed as a simple interface layer allowing a RESTful archive and retrieve API that intelligently manages jobs to a Spectra BlackPearl® Converged Storage System. This intermediary layer abstracts those archive systems and allows for data migration between different systems simultaneously. The Spectra RioBroker application's simplified API reduces the amount of effort required to integrate across a broad range of applications needed by customers.

The Partial File Restore (PFR) plugin adds 'Media Awareness' to the restoration of content from the BlackPearl Converged Storage System using the Spectra RioBroker application. The BlackPearl system natively allows partial file restore using 'byte offsets'. When PFR is enabled, archives flagged with the optional "indexMedia" parameter set to "true" are indexed before being sent to the BlackPearl system. On restore, if a time range is specified, the index is requested from the PFR server by the Spectra RioBroker application, which then converts the request to a time-based file chunk. That chunk is then stored in the temporary storage location specified in the Spectra RioBroker application Marquis Device configuration, the PFR software rewraps it, and it is then transferred to the proper primary storage location.

SYSTEM COMPONENTS AND WORKFLOW

The Spectra RioBroker PFR solution consists of the following components:

- A fully installed and configured BlackPearl system with BlackPearl software versions 4.1.x or 5.x
- A fully installed and configured Spectra RioBroker application
 - The Spectra RioBroker application is only available for 64-bit Microsoft® Windows® operating systems. It is compatible with:
 - Windows 7
 - Windows 10 Pro
 - Windows Server 2008 R2
 - Windows Server 2012
 - Windows Server 2016 recommended
 - The host server must meet the following requirements:
 - 32 GB RAM
 - 500 GB hard drive space
 - 10 Gb/s network connection to the BlackPearl and production storage
- The PFR plugin (running on a Windows Server)
 - In most cases, the PFR software can be run on the same server as the primary Spectra RioBroker installation. The actual indexing load on the server is light, and for small to mid-range installations, the restore/rewrap process is more disk intensive than processor intensive.
 - For larger installations, defined as using a BlackPearl P-Series or multiple BlackPearl S-Series devices, a separate server is recommended. For any installations that use multiple PFR servers for enhanced indexing or restore speed, external servers are required.
 - PFR requires Microsoft .NET Framework 3.5.

The diagram below shows a basic Spectra RioBroker PFR setup.

The MAM sends a command to the Spectra RioBroker application to archive a video file, which will move the file from NAS to a BlackPearl system. If the parameter "indexMedia" is set to "true" in the archive command, then the Spectra RioBroker application uses the PFR plugin to index the file before archiving. The PFR plugin reads the video file and creates an index file it later uses for partial restores. The index files are stored in a location specified when installing the PFR plugin.

The MAM can later send a command to the Spectra RioBroker application to restore a partial file. In the restore command, the MAM specifies the desired time range of the file. The Spectra RioBroker application uses the PFR plugin and the associated index file to convert the time range to a byte range. The Spectra RioBroker application then issues a command to the BlackPearl system to restore the byte range. Next, the Spectra RioBroker application uses the PFR plugin to "wrap" the partial file so it can be used as if it were a complete file. Finally, the Spectra RioBroker application restores the wrapped partial file to the restore location.

Related Information Version Compatibility

Frame Rates: Common supported frame rates are 23.976, 25, 29.97, 50 & 59.94 frames per second. Codecs are supported across a number of frame rates although not all frame rates are available in all codecs/standards.

Wrappers: PFR Supports media wrapped as either MXF Op1a or Quicktime (Self Contained).

CHAPTER 2

Install and Configure the Partial File Restore Plugin

This chapter describes the requirements for the Partial File Restore plugin as well as the installation and configuration instructions.

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INSTALLATION

The basic installation assumes that the Spectra RioBroker application and PFR share the same server. If the installation requires PFR and the Spectra RioBroker application to be installed on separate servers, see Installing on Multiple Servers on page 21 for additional steps.

PFR Installation



Important Before installing the software, it is a best practice to create a restore point in your operating system.

- 1. Contact your Spectra Logic Professional Services representative for the PFR installer.
- **2.** Log into the PFR server as a local Windows Administrator.

3. Create the Endpoint Location directory and Temporary Storage location directory for PFR to use.

- **a.** The Endpoint Location is used for the INDEX_PATH. Navigate to the desired location and create a new folder. You can use any name for the folder. In the [Endpoint Location] folder, create another folder named "BP-PFR".
- **b.** In Windows File Explorer, right click on this folder, and select **Properties**. Select the **Sharing** tab and click **Share**.
- C. The Temporary Storage location is used to hold temp files from PFR. Navigate to the desired location and create a new folder. Consider available file storage and connection speed when determining where to put the Temporary Storage directory. You can use any name for the folder. This location will be used when connecting the PFR service to the Spectra RioBroker application.
- **d.** In Windows File Explorer, right click on this folder, and select **Properties**. Select the **Sharing** tab and click **Share**.
- **4.** In Windows Explorer, navigate to the folder location where the installer packages are located, go to **File ···** Open Command Prompt ··· Open a Command Prompt as Administrator.

The ServerInstaller and IndexerInstaller must be run silently from a command prompt.

a. To run the Service Installer, enter the following:

```
msiexec /i PFRServerinstaller.msi
SERVICEUSERNAME=domain\user SERVICEPASSWORD=*****
INDEX PATH=\\localhost\[Endpoint Location]\\BP-PFR /q
```

b. To run the Index Installer, enter the following:

```
msiexec /i PFRIndexerInstaller.msi
SERVICEUSERNAME=domain\user SERVICEPASSWORD=*****
INDEX_PATH=\\localhost\[Endpoint Location]\\BP-PFR /q
```

Where:

- SERVICEUSERNAME is the system user account that will be used by the service, this account must be a local administrator account. If the server is connected to active directory, utilize the active directory domain. If the server is not connected to active directory, the domain will be the computer name. To find the computer name, open a command prompt and type the command hostname.
- SERVICEPASSWORD is the password for the SERVICEUSERNAME. The password will be shown in plaintext, but is encrypted through the installation process.
- INDEX_PATH is the UNC path for the folder that will contain the index files. For example, if the UNC file path is "C:\Media\BP-PFR" it will be installed as "INDEX_PATH=\\localhost\media\BP-PFR".

5. After the installation completes, A PFR Log Viewer shortcut, a PFR Configuration shortcut, and a shortcut to a file named 'ServerName PFR Product Token' display on the desktop of the server. Submit the token to Spectra Logic via the Support Portal (https://support.spectralogic.com) by creating a new Support Incident.

- **6.** Once received, install the permanent license.
 - **a.** Right click the PFR Configuration application shortcut on the desktop and select **Run as Administrator**. The Welcome screen displays.

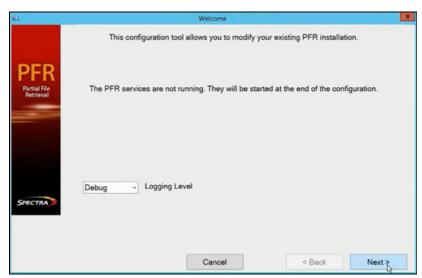


Figure 2 The Welcome screen.

b. Do not change the logging level. **Debug** provides the maximum logging. Click **Next**. The Import License File screen displays.

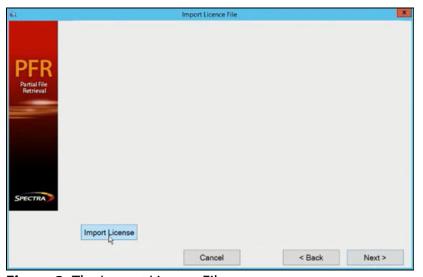


Figure 3 The Import License File screen.

c. Click Import License, the License screen displays.

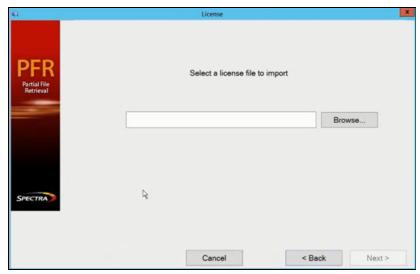


Figure 4 The License screen.

d. Browse to the location of the license file and click **Next**. The System Configuration screen displays.

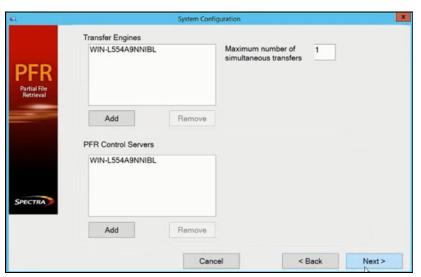


Figure 5 The System Configuration screen.

e. By default the details of the current local machine automatically display as both a Transfer Engine and a PFR Control Server, and do not need to be adjusted. If desired, click **Add** to enter additional Transfer Engines to allow greater redundancy and throughput, or to enter additional PFR Control Servers for redundancy.

f. Depending on the license installed, edit the **Maximum number of simultaneous transfers**. Click **Next** to continue. The Summary screen displays.

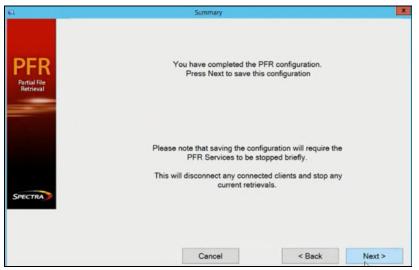


Figure 6 The PFR Summary screen.

- **g.** Click **Next**. The PFR Configuration application saves the configuration changes and starts the PFR services.
- **7.** Open the Services screen and for each of the following services, confirm that the service is configured to Log On As 'Administrator' and that the service is running.
 - BlackPearl PFR Index Service
 - Marquis Log Service
 - Medway Engine Server
 - MedwaySync

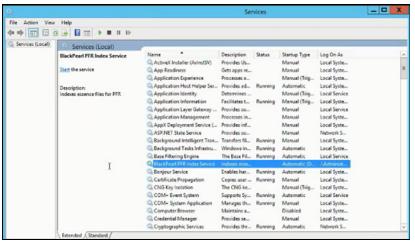


Figure 7 The Services screen.

- If 'Log On As' is not 'Administrator', do the following:
 - **a.** Right click the service and select **Properties**. The *Service* Properties screen displays. Select the **Log On** tab.

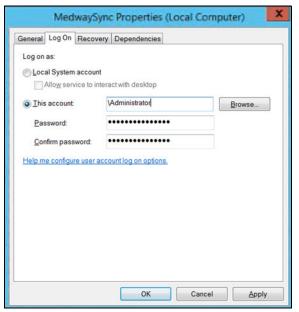


Figure 8 The *Service* Properties screen.

- **b.** Select **This account** and enter \Administrator.
- **c.** Enter and confirm the password and click **OK**.
- If the service is not running, select the service and click **Start** the service in the upper left corner of the Services screen.

Repeat this step for each additional service listed.

Spectra RioBroker Setup for PFR

- **1.** If necessary, use the following instructions to download and install the Spectra RioBroker software.
 - **a.** Open your web browser and navigate to: https://developer.spectralogic.com/rio
 - **b.** Download the latest version of the RioBroker software installer file.
 - **c.** Start the installation by double clicking SpectraRioBrokerSetup-x.x.x.msi, where x.x.x indicates the version of the software.
 - **d.** Follow the on-screen instructions to install the application.

Note: If prompted by the installer, reboot your Windows system.

- **2.** Open the Services screen and confirm that the Spectra RioBroker service is configured to Log On As 'Administrator' and that the service is running.
 - If 'Log On As' is not 'Administrator', do the following:
 - **a.** Right click the service and select **Properties**. The *Service* Properties screen displays. Select the **Log On tab**.

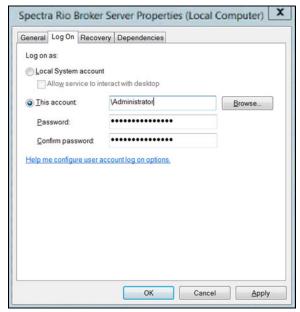


Figure 9 The Service Properties screen.

- **b.** Select **This account** and enter \Administrator.
- **c.** Enter and confirm the password and click **OK**.
- If the service is not running, select the service and click **Start** the service in the upper left corner of the Services screen.
- **3.** Using a web browser, navigate to https://localhost:5050/app/login.
 - **Notes:** The application requires a secure connection.
 - If necessary, resolve the security warning for the application.
 - The RioBroker user interface has a 60 minute session time out setting.

4. If this is the first time launching the application, the Cluster Welcome screen displays. Otherwise, the login page displays (see Step 6 on page 17).

5. Create a new cluster.

A Cluster is a logical designation for a set of RioBroker installations that reference each other in order to form a set of servers that scale for increased data movement using shared databases. The main node assigns jobs to secondary nodes in the cluster. Secondary nodes fail over to each other in the event of a failure.

a. Click **New**. The Create Cluster dialog box displays.

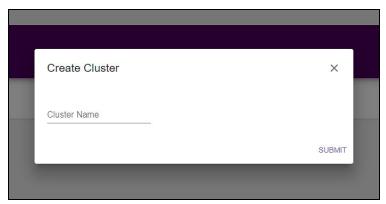


Figure 11 The Create Cluster dialog box.

- **b.** Enter the desired cluster **Name**.
- **c.** Click **Submit**. The Spectra RioBroker login screen displays.

6. On the login screen, enter the **Username** and **Password**.

Note: The default username and password are both "**spectra**".

7. Click **Login**. The Dashboard screen displays showing an overview of the Spectra RioBroker application.

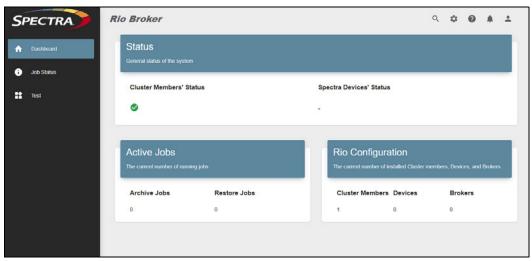


Figure 13 The Dashboard screen.

Create Devices

Once you are logged in to the application, use the instructions below to create a device as a data repository target. Both the BlackPearl system and the PFR plugin must be configured as Spectra RioBroker devices.

On the toolbar in the upper-right of the application window, click **Settings** (gear icon) ••• **Devices**. The Devices screen displays.

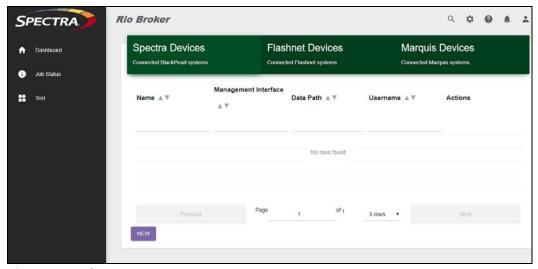


Figure 14 The Devices screen.

Create a Spectra Device

- **1.** If necessary, click Spectra Devices to highlight the Spectra tab.
- **2.** Click **New**. The Add Spectra Device dialog box displays.

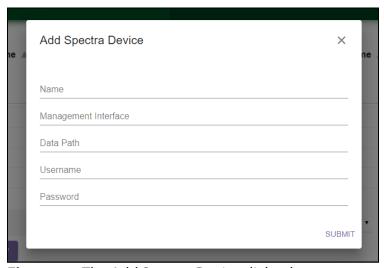


Figure 15 The Add Spectra Device dialog box.

- **3.** Enter the desired **Name** for the Spectra device. Spectra Logic recommends using the name assigned to the BlackPearl system.
- **4.** Enter the **Management Interface** IP address of the desired BlackPearl target. Do not include http or https.

Note: If you are using an IPv6 address to communicate with the BlackPearl system, you must use square brackets ([]) at the start and end of the IPv6 address.

5. If you are connecting to a BlackPearl simulator for testing or development purposes, enter the **Data Path** IP address of the desired BlackPearl target specifying http or https. Otherwise leave this field blank and RioBroker retrieves this IP address automatically.

Note: If you are using an IPv6 address to communicate with the BlackPearl system, you must use square brackets ([]) at the start and end of the IPv6 address.

6. Enter the **Username** and **Password** of a user configured on the BlackPearl target.

Note: Only users with Administrator or Monitor permissions are allowed. Users with only Login privileges are not supported by the RioBroker application.

7. Click **Submit**. The Devices screen displays showing the newly created Spectra device.

Create a Marquis Device

- **1.** Click Marquis Devices to highlight the Marquis tab.
- **2.** Click **New**. The Add Marquis Device dialog box displays.

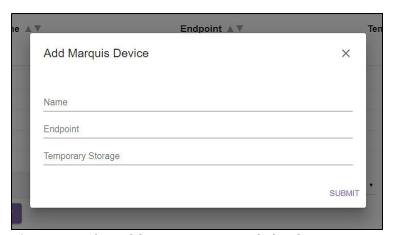


Figure 16 The Add Marquis Device dialog box.

3. Enter the desired **Name** for the Marquis device.

Note: The **Name** cannot include spaces.

4. Enter the **Endpoint** IP address of the desired Marquis target in the format: http(s)://<IP address>:60792.

Note: 60792 is the port used by PFR.

- **5.** Enter the UNC path (for example, file:///C:/TEMP_PFR) for the **Temporary Storage** location of the desired Marquis target. This is the directory created in Step c on page 10.
- **6.** Click **Submit**. The Devices screen displays showing the newly created Marquis device.

Create a Broker

Once you create a device in RioBroker, use the instructions below to create a data broker.

A broker is a logical construct that defines a specific archive environment which must include exactly one default archive agent bucket on a BlackPearl system. Each broker can also contain one or more other readonly agents from which objects can be retrieved. Any number of brokers can be defined within the RioBroker application to allow multi-bucket support for archives.

On the toolbar in the upper-right of the application window, click **Settings** (gear icon) ••• **Brokers**. The Brokers screen displays.

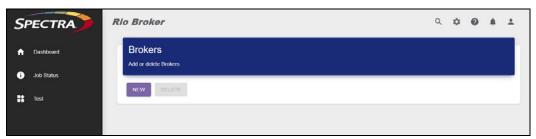


Figure 17 The Brokers screen.

1. Click **New**. The Add Broker dialog box displays.

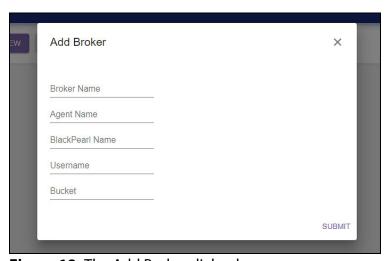


Figure 18 The Add Broker dialog box.

2. Enter the desired **Broker Name** and **Agent Name**.

Notes: • The Broker and Agent name can be anything but it is a best practice for both to use the same name as the associated BlackPearl bucket name.

- The Spectra RioBroker application will change any name entered to all lower case characters.
- **3.** Enter the **BlackPearl Name** of the BlackPearl system configured in Step 3 on page 18.

- **4.** Enter the **Username** of a user configured on the BlackPearl system specified in Step 3.
- **5.** Enter the name of a **Bucket** associated with the user specified in Step 4. Make sure that this bucket has the desired data placement and Advanced Bucket Management (ABM) policy. See the *BlackPearl Converged Storage System User Guide* for more information.

Note: The bucket must already exist on the BlackPearl system.

6. Click Submit.

Installing on Multiple Servers

If you are installing the Spectra RioBroker application and PFR on separate servers, complete the additional steps outlined below.

- **1.** All file locations created during the PFR and Spectra RioBroker installations need to be shared and accessible by both servers. To share a folder between servers:
 - **a.** Start Windows Explorer.
 - **b.** Right-click the folder that you want to share and then select **Sharing** and **Security**.
 - **c.** On the **Sharing** tab, select **Share this folder**. Windows automatically uses the name of the folder as the share name (if there is not already another share that uses the name on the computer). You can change the share name if you want to use a different name.
 - d. Click Permissions.
 - **e.** In the Permissions for *Folder Name* dialog box, click **Add**.
 - f. In the Select Users or Groups dialog box, type the names of the users or groups that you want to add to the shared folder, and then click OK.
 - **g.** To grant or remove a user or group permission for the shared folder, click the user or group in the Group or user names dialog box, and then select or clear the **Allow or Deny** check box next to the permission that you want to grant or deny.
 - **h.** In the Group or user names list, select **Everyone**, and then click **Remove**.
 - i. Click OK.
- **2.** Media should be stored in a location that is accessible by both servers. Follow the steps above to ensure that the folder is shared to both Spectra RioBroker and PFR servers.
- **3.** The user logged into the Spectra RioBroker Service needs to have administrator permission on the Spectra RioBroker server as well as the PFR server.

Testing the Installation Test Setup

TESTING THE INSTALLATION

To test the PFR installation, you need to download Postman. Postman is a generic restful client with a free version available for Windows OS and macOS. Postman is used for sending commands through the Spectra RioBroker application.

Postman can be downloaded from https://www.getpostman.com/downloads/.

Test Setup

1. Start Postman. The main screen displays.

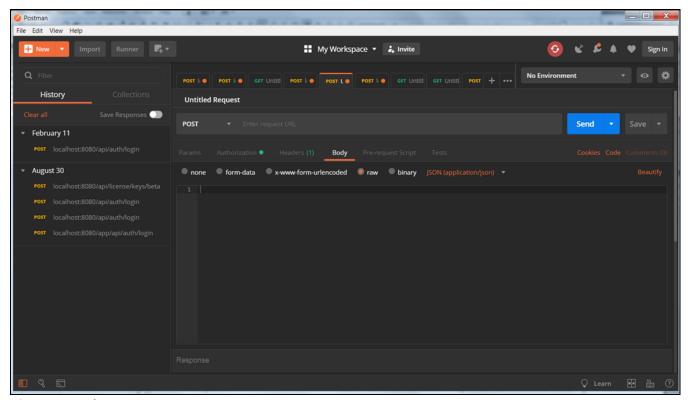


Figure 19 The Postman main screen.

Testing the Installation Test Setup

2. Navigate to **File ··· Settings**. The settings screen displays.

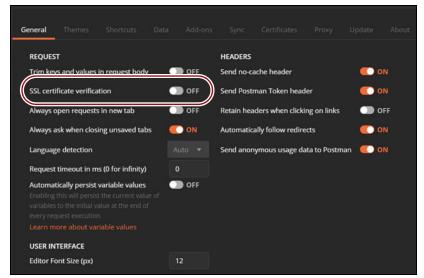


Figure 20 The Postman Settings screen

- **3.** Turn off **SSL certificate verification** and close the Settings dialog box.
- **4.** If necessary, on the main screen select the Body tab. Verify that **raw** and **JSON (application/json)** are selected. See Figure 19.
- **5.** Use the following steps to obtain an authorization token. Authorizationtokens expire in one hour, but can be generated as often as needed during testing.

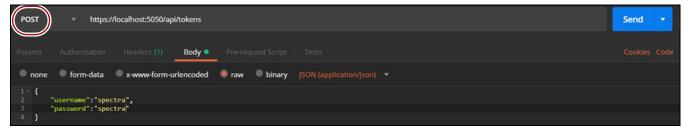


Figure 21 Request an authorization token using Postman.

- **a.** If necessary, select **POST** from the drop-down menu next to the Request URL field.
- **b.** Enter the command https://localhost:5050/api/tokens in the Request URL field.
- **c.** In the Body area, enter:

    "username":"spectra",
    "password":"spectra"
}
```

d. Click **Send**. The response displays in the response pane. Copy the token.

e. In the workspace, select the Authorization tab.

f. Very that Type is set to Bearer Token and paste the token in the Token field.

Note: Each new tab in Postman needs to have the token pasted into the authorization field.

Test with a Small Text File

1. Create a small text file to use for testing.

2. Use the following steps to archive the small text file to the BlackPearl system using the Spectra RioBroker application.

Note: The following example uses a file named Testing1.txt located on the desktop.

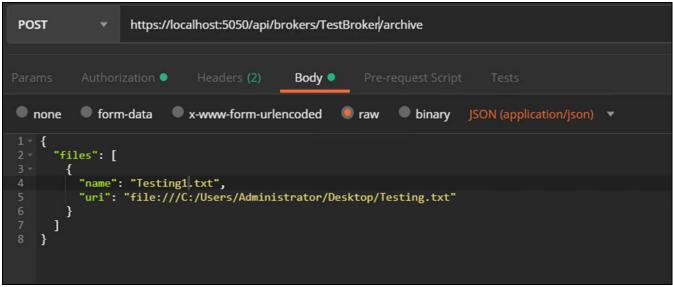


Figure 24 An archive request example.

- **a.** If necessary, select **POST** from the drop-down menu next to the Request URL field.
- **b.** Enter the command https://localhost:5050/api/brokers/ {brokername}/archive in the Request URL field. Use the broker name configured in Step 2 on page 20.
- **c.** In the Body area, enter:

d. Click **Send**. The response displays in the response pane.

- **3.** Check that a file was successfully archived using either the Spectra RioBroker user interface or Postman.
 - Using the Spectra RioBroker user interface, select Job Status in the taskbar, and then select the Completed Jobs tab. If the archive was successful, you will see it listed on this page. If the job is not listed there, then select the Failed Jobs tab. Select a failed job to see additional information about why the job failed. Using Postman,
 - **a.** Select **GET** from the drop-down menu next to the Request URL field.
 - **b.** Enter the command https://localhost:5050/api/jobs/ {jobId} in the Request URL field. For jobId, use the ID from the archive request response.
 - **c.** Click **Send**. The response will list the Job ID, creation date, last updated date, and the status of the job.
- **4.** Use the following steps to restore the small text file.
 - **a.** If necessary, select **POST** from the drop-down menu next to the Request URL field.
 - **b.** Enter the command https://localhost:5050/api/brokers/ {brokername}/restore in the Request URL field. Use the broker name configured in Step 2 on page 20.

Testing the Installation Test with PFR

c. In the Body area, enter:

The file URI needs to be directed to a different location than from the files original location. It is a best practice to create a separate restore folder.

d. Click **Send**. The response displays in the response pane.

Test with PFR

- **1.** To test PFR, identify a media file to use for testing. You will need to know if the media file has a Drop Frame Rate (29.97 FPS) or a Non-Drop Frame Rate (25 FPS). This will change how the restore is processed.
- **2.** Use the following steps to archive the media file to the BlackPearl system using the Spectra RioBroker application and PFR. The following example uses a file named MAAAAA60SE2.mxf .

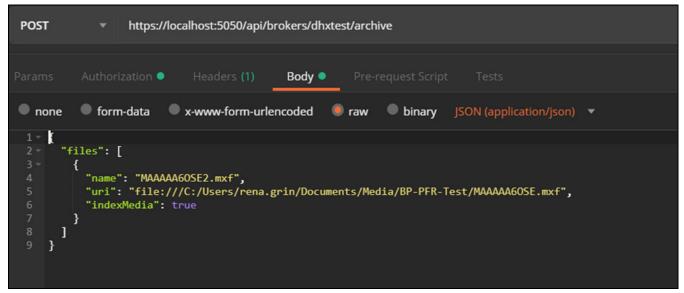


Figure 26 An archive request example.

- **a.** If necessary, select **POST** from the drop-down menu next to the Request URL field.
- **b.** Enter the command https://localhost:5050/api/brokers/ {brokername}/archive in the Request URL field. Use the broker name configured in Step 2 on page 20.

Testing the Installation Test with PFR

c. In the Body area, enter:

- **d.** Click **Send**. The response displays in the response pane.
- **3.** Check that a file was successfully archived using either the Spectra RioBroker user interface or Postman.
 - Using the Spectra RioBroker user interface, select Job Status in the taskbar, and then select the Completed Jobs tab. If the archive was successful, you will see it listed on this page. If the job is not listed there, then select the Failed Jobs tab. Select a failed job to see additional information about why the job failed. Using Postman,
 - **a.** Select **GET** from the drop-down menu next to the Request URL field.
 - **b.** Enter the command https://localhost:5050/api/jobs/ {jobId} in the Request URL field. For jobId, use the ID from the archive request response.
 - **c.** Click **Send**. The response will list the Job ID, creation date, last updated date, and the status of the job.
- **4.** Use the following steps to restore the media file.

Notes: • When restoring a media file with PFR, the time code range for the restore needs to be specified (see example on page 29).

- When attempting to restore a media file with a Drop Frame Rate (29.97 FPS) you need to use the ";" character in the time code range line to specify the frame number.
- When attempting to restore a media file with Non-Drop Frame Rate (25 FPS) use the ":" character in the time code range line.

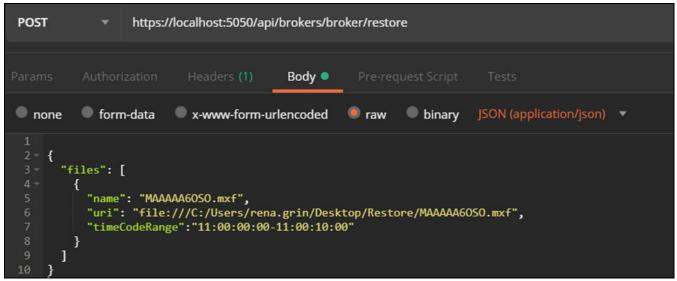


Figure 28 Restoring a Non-Drop Frame Rate media file.

INDEX AND RESTORE FILES

Indexing, determining the byte offset for a partial file restore, and processing a partial file restore are accomplished through API calls to the PFR services. These are handled automatically by the plugin. See System Components and Workflow on page 5 for a description of the workflow.

TROUBLESHOOT PFR ISSUES

If the PFR plugin is not indexing or restoring files as expected, open the Services screen and for each of the following services, confirm that the service is configured to Log On As 'Administrator' and that the service is running.

- BlackPearl PFR Index Service
- Marquis Log Service
- Medway Engine Server
- MedwaySync

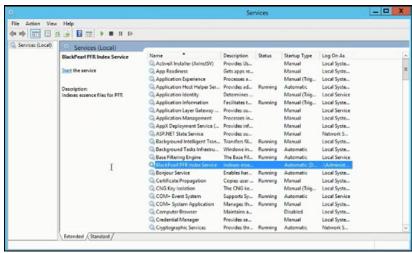


Figure 29 The Services screen.

- If 'Log On As' is not 'Administrator', do the following:
 - **a.** Right click the service and select **Properties**. The *Service* Properties screen displays. Select the **Log On tab**.

- **b.** Select **This account** and enter \Administrator.
- **c.** Enter and confirm the password and click **OK**.
- If the service is not running, select the service and click Start the service in the upper left corner of the Services screen.

Repeat these steps for each additional service listed.
